## Joyce Huston - Lady 'J'

Once in a while there are those people you happen to meet who make a lasting impression. I had the opportunity to meet such a person over this past holiday season. I am sure that many of you reading this column were also in attendance at this party, as the turnout was wonderful, not to mention the delicious food, beverages and entertainment that were provided by our most gracious hostesses. Each person in attendance also received a gift...how is that for welcome hospitality?!

The best gift of the evening however, came when Ms. Joyce Huston, better known to her adoring public as "Lady J," took to the floor to do her thing. Singing Christmas tunes and playing her beloved trumpet she wowed and entertained guests, inviting accompaniment from anyone in attendance. Now, "Lady J" is no amateur, she is an artist with several credits to her name including singer/songwriter/motivational speaker and musician with a work history that could make even seasoned pros envious!

"Lady J" began her career in her hometown of St. Louis, Missouri before graduating high school. Her first big opportunity to make her talents shine was while performing in the musical "Music Man" which starred Tony Randall. She also had the opportunity to have her star shine singing in Johnny Johnson's (Chuck Berry's piano player) band on the St. Louis river front.

Fully realizing her talent enabled her to attend the University of Kansas and Howard University on academic scholarships, studying music composition/theory. While attending Howard University in D.C. and as a member of the universities Jazz Ensemble, she recorded an album and performed with such greats as Lionel Hampton, Alberta Hunter and musicians of Duke Ellington's and Ella Fitzgerald's bands. she also opened for rappers Run DMC, performed with Donald Byrd on Capitol Hill, and was a guest performer on shows with Dizzy Gillespie and Freddy Hubbard.

"Lady J's" career aspirations eventually took her to the West coast shores of California where she joined the "Albert 'Blues Boy' King Band". This particular career move enabled her to tour the United States as both trumpeter and vocalist (her greatest musical joys) and work with such Blues greats as B.B. King, Millie Jackson, John Lee Hooker, Muddy Waters, Albert Collins, Bobby Blue Band and Rufus Thomas, just to name a few!

While still with Albert King, she appeared on several television shows such as, "Maintenance Shop Blues," a special hosted by Dick Clark, and a nationally televised show taped in L.A. at the Forum Coliseum which included Eddie "Clean Head" Vinson, Bob Mayal, Etta James, Bo Diddley and others.

"Lady J" is now a resident Las Vegas still working her musical magic yet, she is also involved in community awareness concerning Fibromyalgia Syndrome (FMS). She is currently hosting public speaking forums to bring awareness about FMS' origin and a possible cure while maintaining volunteer status on the FMS/CFS board of directors and assisting as its webmaster. Her musical career in Vegas continues to thrive with local acts on and off the strip.
